History

Ramathibodi School of Nursing was founded on July 27, 1965 as part of the Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. The initial curriculum was drawn up with expert advice in nursing education from the United States and sponsorship from the Rockefeller Center, giving the school a head start in providing the most modern nursing education in the Asian region.



Ramathibodi School of Nursing has implemented small-class teaching among its undergraduate students, which fully encompasses a student-centered teaching process, mostly adopting PBL (Problem-Based Learning) and TBL (Team-Based Learning) teaching concepts. The graduate and postgraduate programs emphasize the study of nursing theory, nursing services, preventive health care and scientific research. At the same time, it focuses on the cultivating and training of students through theoretical and practical education. This approach helps facilitate our students in advanced knowledge, specific skillsets, critical thinking, decision-making ability, and teamwork/leadership competencies. The classrooms and clinical teaching of the school are carried out by highly qualified instructors that are rich in clinical knowledge and work experience. Ramathibodi Hospital School of Nursing has advanced educational concepts, promotes distinctive teaching practices, and offers first-class teaching, it is one of the most well-known and

respected nursing schools found in Thailand and all of Southeast Asia. The school is well received and favored by Thai and international students alike. Consequently, the employment rate of graduate students of Ramathibodi School of Nursing is among the highest in Thailand.

Ramathibodi School of Nursing operates separate campuses, located in three different Provinces.

The original building at Phayathai, Bangkok serves the third- and fourth-year undergraduate nursing students, who study theory and take part in clinical practice at Ramathibodi Hospital. This location includes master students who also have clinical practices at Ramathibodi Hospital.



The second campus, which includes beautiful scenery, is located at **Salaya, Nakorn Pratom Province** which is about a 40-minute drive from Bangkok. This second building serves the first- and second-year undergraduate nursing students who primarily study basic science and fundamental nursing, this location also includes master and doctoral nursing students who take nursing theory courses.



The last campus, the Chakri Naruebodindra Medical Institute, partly serves the undergraduate and master nursing students who are practicing in various clinics.



One of Thailand's oldest and most prestigious public universities, Mahidol University began in 1888 as the medical school of Siriraj Hospital. In 1969 it was given the name Mahidol University, in honor of H.R.H. Prince Mahidol of Songkla, who is known as the Father of Modern Medicine and Public Health in Thailand. 



Pediatric nursing is a field of study related to assessment, diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation, health promotion, prevention of diseases as well as complications, and promoting the family potential of every family to take care of children's health in every age range from newborns to children with healthy and high-risk groups during chronic, acute, critical illnesses and end-of-life; using family-centered care concept; developing a model/ innovation/ practice guideline to improve the quality of care by integrating nursing science, related science, technology, empirical evidence, aesthetic, ethics, professional law, and an understanding of the experience and identity of child and family to create a practice guideline and good outcomes for children with illnesses, families, organizations, and health service system.

Teaching and learning methods focus on the student-centered by preparing students to be a life-long learning person. Be able to updating of academic and technology, learning from practice, having leadership skills, working with multidisciplinary team, and having working culture that strives for excellence based on the sufficiency economy.

- 1) Having ability to manage complex health problems in children of all ages, all target groups, all health conditions until the end of life by integrating the science of pediatric nursing, related science and empirical evidence in multicultural nursing practice based on professional standards and professional ethics

Philosophy and the importance of the course

Community nurse practitioner program is a field of study that focus on the analysis of health problems, factors determining health status and management of common health problems in individuals, families, and communities through screening, referral, primary medical care of all ages, health promotion. disease prevention and disease management, chronic conditions and end-of-life care in the community by integrating knowledge from Community Nurse Practitioner, Epidemiology, Population studies, Medicine, Technology and empirical evidence, public policy for health including ethics, codes of conduct, law, the arts of nursing. An understanding of experience and humanity to create a practical process and good outcomes for individuals, families, target groups, communities, and health service systems

Philosophy and importance of the curriculum

Master of Nursing Science Program in Gerontological Nurse Practitioner is a field of study that deals with comprehensive health assessment, screening, early diagnosis and primary medical care. It includes emergency care and referral, planning, nursing care, and outcome evaluation in caring for the healthy older adults, at-risk groups, acute and chronic illnesses, long-term care, and end-of-life care either in the community or long-term care facilities. The study in the curriculum is believed to create professional nurses who can effectively perform gerontological nurse practitioner, be a leader in system building, team building, and health management, in accordance with the competency of nursing practitioners and the gerontological nurse prescribed by the Thailand Nursing and Midwifery Council (TNMC) for the older persons to maintain their good health and quality of life.

6) Perform nursing practice, health promotion, disease prevention, screening and referring, primary medical care of common health problems of older adults, emergency care as well as rehabilitation and caring for dependent older adults or with chronic illnesses to access the health care service system thoroughly end-of-life care by engaging family and their social networks and taking into account cultural differences




- Student whose research thesis involves human beings must undergo training or courses in the area of Ethics in Human Research provided by the Faculty of Graduate Studies according to the curriculum. (Details are available on www.grad.mahidol.ac.th)
- Student must present research project to The Mahidol University Institutional Review Board (MU-IRB) within 90 days after thesis/thematic paper proposal examination, and before the beginning of conducting research, for any faculties that have no Institutional Review Board of Ethics in Human Research committee.
- Student whose research involves animals for experimental purposes must gain direct approval from the Research Management and Development Department.
- Any original documents certifying any research animals for experimental animals for experimental involving human beings or animals for experimental purposes must be attached in the complete thesis's appendix / thematic paper's appendix


Student conducts research and contacts major advisor in person or other ways at least once per month. Student must report his/her progress and research performance to major advisor, the major advisor will assess the progress in research performance and gives the result P/S/U to Program Director and Dean of FGS every semester until the thesis is completed. (Form GR 42)

Changes in the thesis / thematic paper title and the advisory committee can be done by submitting the request to the major advisor, Program Director and Dean of FGS (Form GR.49 Requirements for Thesis/ Thematic Paper Revision Form)

- Student who is qualified to take the thesis / thematic paper defense examination must:
- Spend no less than 90 days (including holidays) doing the thesis or no less than 45 days (including holiday) doing the thematic paper starting from the day when the thesis or thematic paper title and the Thesis or Thematic Paper Advisory Committee are approved by the Dean of FGS
 - Pass every course according to the criteria of the curriculum and obtain no lower than a 3.00 GPA.
 - Pass the English language or Foreign language proficiency requirement as set by FGS
 - Pass the Comprehensive Examination for a plan B Master's degree student. (Form GR 27 and Form GR 36)
 - Be approved by the Thesis or Thematic Paper Advisory Committee.
 - Submit the thesis or thematic paper manuscript and abstract written in the approved language, to the Thesis or Thematic Paper Defense Committee for reading at least 15 working days before the examination date

The process of preparing the original copy of thesis / thematic paper and request for thesis / thematic paper checking format service.

1. Student must prepare the original copy of thesis / thematic paper in the format required by FGS.
2. Student should submit the Cover Page, Entitled Page, Approval Page and Abstract Page to the staff of Academic Services Section, FGS, Salaya Campus to have those checked before the defense examination date. This provides student to be able to bring Entitled Page and Approval Page to the Thesis / Advisory Committee and The Thesis / Defense Examination Committee to sign after passing the defense exam. (result : PASSED)
3. After passing the defense exam. Student should bring the original copy of thesis / thematic paper (hard copy and electronic file) to the staff of Academic Services Section, FGS. to have the thesis / thematic paper format checked. Allow at least four working days for service.
4. As for the English Thesis Abstract / Thematic paper Abstract, student should have the Language Center Staff (at the 2nd floor of Graduate Studies Building, Salaya Campus) checked for the English Grammar, the English Abstract should be in a double space format.
5. After having the English Abstract checked by the Language Center Staff, and having corrected, student should submit the final version of the abstract together with Entitled Page and Approval Page to the Dean of FGS to sign. The Dean of FGS will be the last person to sign after other committee members, Program Director and Dean of Faculty where the program held have signed.

- Student must submit the complete thesis or thematic paper (one original and one copy) plus CD in word file and PDF file to the FGS within 21 days (including holidays) of passing the defense exam with "passed" result. A fee will be charged for late submission 200 bath / working day. The "delayed submission" can not last more than 90 days (including holidays) after the "PASSED" result.

- Cancellation of thesis or thematic paper examination result if the delayed submission of the complete thesis or thematic paper and CD has not been received by the FGS within 90 days (including holidays) after the "passed" result, the FGS will cancel the thesis or thematic paper examination result. If the student still wants to receive the degree, the student must register and start the entire processes of the thesis or thematic paper again.

Student must submit the evidence for Thesis Publishing for Graduation.

FGS gives consideration regarding referrals to the Mahidol University Council for authorization of degree

Student is awarded the degree and then she/he can get certificate of Graduation and Transcript

Nursing Program Curriculum

All Thai nursing curricula approved by the curriculum committee and the committee of Ramathibodi School of Nursing (graduate studies) will share with master's students in both theory and clinical practice. The curriculum plans of all 6 Thai curricula and one international program are as follows.

1. Master of Nursing Science (Pediatric Nursing)
2. Master of Nursing Science in Community Nurse Practitioner
3. Master of Nursing Science (Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing)
4. Master of Nursing Science (Adult and Gerontological Nursing)
5. Master of Nursing Science in Gerontological Nurse Practitioner
6. Master of Nursing Science in Nurse Midwifery (Currently, this curriculum is not available due to shortages of nursing faculty in nurse-midwifery)

All students in Thai curricula will study four core courses composed of RANS 601: Nursing Research, RANS 603: Statistics, RANS 662: Theoretical Foundation in Advanced Nursing Practice, and RANS 663: Health Policy and Nursing Leadership. For other courses, students in each area of specialty will study on their own courses. For example, students in the Master of Nursing Science (Adult and Gerontological Nursing) will have their own practicum courses in RANS 522: Advanced Nursing Practice in Adult and Elderly I and RANS 523: Advanced Nursing Practice in Adult and Elderly II while students in the Master of Nursing Science (Pediatric Nursing) will study in RANS 518: Nursing Care of Well Child and Risk Groups and RANS 519: Nursing Care of Children with Acute Critical and Chronic Illness.

For the Master of Nursing Science (International Program), students will study core courses composed of RANS 701: Applied Statistics in Nursing Research, RANS 702: Concepts and Theories in Nursing, RANS 703: Issues and Trends in Global Health, RANS 705: Health Care Policy and Leadership, and RANS 706: Research Methodology in Nursing and the Use of Evidence-Based Practice. In terms of practicum courses, students will study RANS 717: Practicum in Advanced Nursing I and RANS 718: Practicum in Advanced Nursing II. Since these practicum courses for students in international programs will study based on their area of specialty. For example, students who have a focus on adult and gerontological nursing will have the practicum at the ward of the hospital while students who have a focus on community health nursing will have their practice in the primary health care units and community hospitals.

Generally, the first semester will begin around the middle of August of every year. Each semester is around 4 months. The second semester will begin the first week of January of every year. The summer semester will begin in May of every year. There is an academic calendar available via the website. Please visit and view additional details at [Current Student: Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University](#). Graduate students will have an orientation day arranged by the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Ramathibodi School of Nursing. Additionally, all students will meet nursing faculty members of each special field.

Graduate students are required to have professional and personal skill development according to the graduate studies policy. There are six skills composed of 1) communication and language skills, 2) leadership and management skills, 3) creative and innovative skills, 4) digital literacy skills, 5) health literacy skills, and 6) entrepreneurial literacy skills. Students need to obtain 4 from 6 professional and personal skill development. However, Mahidol University promotes all students should have entrepreneurial literacy skills. Ramathibodi School of Nursing (RSON) thus requires this skill to be one of all four skills that students need to obtain. Students need to pass all these skills before their oral thesis defense. Students can access the website, [Professional Skills Developments - Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University](#) which is a free course online Coursera. Moreover, graduate students need to pass the English examination issued by the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University before having their oral thesis defense as well.

At the beginning of the semester, graduate students will attend classes on introduction to statistics (reviewing for students), the use of the ENDNOTE program and Turnitin, databases, and information technology needed for searching and studying. If any students cannot attend the ENDNOTE program and Turnitin, databases, and information technology as scheduled, they can make an additional appointment as a person or a group with the staff of Ramathibodi School of Nursing.

Students can use all libraries available on all campuses via the Mahidol University website at <https://www.li.mahidol.ac.th> Additionally, students in each field can also use the services of an interlibrary loan if they need to borrow any textbooks from other campuses. Furthermore, students can ask for obtaining any academic document delivery and renew their library cards and books. Students can search any academic articles via e-databases. Please visit the website of "Library-Mahidol University" (<https://www.li.mahidol.ac.th/eng/>). Additionally,

there is online training/workshop which students can access and learn independently, such as the topic, “Ask me anything: Scopus and ScienceDirect,” and the topic, “How to choose the best journals to publish your manuscripts in.” See www.li.mahido.ac.th/eng/online-training-workshops/ For Ramathibodi medical library, students can search academic information from e-databases, such as “COVID-19, e-databases, e-journals, e-books, Thai e-databases, citation databases and impact factor, EzProxy (accessing e-databases from off campus)”

Students will attend classes in both theories and practicum courses and they will have some extra curricula they need to attend. For example, in Thai curricula, students participate in the basic life support for lay people and attend the orientation and graduation days. Students participate in the ceremony of paying respects to teachers.

For the Master of Nursing Science (International Program), students join activities of extra curricula, such as visiting the Museum Siam in Bangkok, attending the ceremony of paying respects to teachers, and visiting primary health care units and community hospitals.

Normally, master’s students need to defend and pass their proposal examination first. After that, they will need to process all the institutional review board (IRB) documents (visit IRB of Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University via <https://www2.ra.mahidol.ac.th/e-submission>) to get approval within 90 days after the date of passing their proposal examination by filling out the form of GR.1: Thesis title and thesis advisory committee/Thematic paper title and thematic paper advisory committee. Students can fill out the form which is available via the website **Current Student: Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University**. There are additional forms that students can learn which forms are required for them to fill out. The RSON staff who work for each curriculum can share advice and appropriate documents with individual students. Students are encouraged to have the proposal examination after ending the first year of study.

For the master’s thesis defense, after passing the oral thesis defense, the student needs to fill out the form of GR.2: Oral thesis defense and committee/ Oral thematic paper defense and committee. If students pass without condition, they will have 21 days (including weekends either) of revising their thesis. If students cannot complete their revision in time, they will be charged for delayed submission of the thesis (200 baht/day). If the students pass their oral thesis defense with a condition, they will need to revise their drafts of the thesis and complete all the

processes within 90 days. If any student fails the oral thesis defense, he/she needed to re-register and re-examination. All rules and guidelines for the thesis are needed to comply with Mahidol University Regulation on Graduate Studies B.E.2563 (2020). Please see additional details of the university regulation.

Master of Nursing Science in all Thai and international programs have provided an equal opportunity of race, color, gender, religion, national origin, age, disability, genetic information, marital status, sexual orientation, or any other issues protected by Mahidol University law.

Communication

E-mail and LINE applications are the primary methods of communication with the nursing faculty of the Ramathibodi School of Nursing (RSON) Program. Students are encouraged to be in touch with the course instructor and nursing instructors of all courses. Students can find e-mail and office phone available in the course syllabus.

Criminal records

Graduate studies will send international students' names and passports living in countries that might be a risk group, such as countries in Africa Continent (See details in the Appendix) to the National Intelligence Agency during students applying the application or before accepting to study at the university.

Student Advisement

Students need to be responsible for:

1. Orientation program before the start of the nursing program.
2. They need to know the curriculum requirements as they appear in the University Catalogue, and they need to follow all the course sequences.
3. They must make appointments with their advisor for course planning and approval.

Student Health Care

Students can use University Health Care Services, which are located at the Student Health Care Unit, composed of 7 location areas. These depend on the student's program. The locations are:

1. Health Care Unit at Salaya
2. Student Health Care at the Faculty of Medicine, Siriraj Hospital
3. Student Health Care Unit at the Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital
4. Student Health Care Unit at the Faculty of Tropical Medicine
5. Student Health Care Unit at the Faculty of Science
6. Student Health Care Unit at the Faculty of Pharmacy
7. Student Health Care Unit at the Faculty of Dentistry

Please visit: **For International Students, Mahidol Student Affairs**. This website provides student health care insurance from an affiliated company or university. Graduate students at Ramathibodi School of Nursing, (RSON) need to register to obtain an identification card for Ramathibodi Hospital first. After that, they will make an appointment to visit a doctor on the second

floor, Building 1, Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. Generally, international students pay for health care insurance (3,500 baths/year) to cover their illnesses. Thai students generally are covered by their own health care services.

Academic advising and career services

Generally, in the first year, a master's student will be assigned an academic advisor. He/she can make an appointment via LINE or e-mail with the academic advisor in order to meet. In terms of contact for academic consultation, the course instructor will provide the list of the lecturers' names, e-mail, and office phone, which are available in the course syllabus of each subject.

Banking Services

Thai students generally will have their own banking accounts. International students may need to open a bank account in a location convenient for them. They can also apply a bank application to help transfer the transaction.

Campus Recreation Services

Mahidol University provides recreation services on all campuses, such as the sports recreation center at Mahidol University (Salaya Campus), the sports and recreation center at Chakri Naruebodindra Medical Institute, and the sports center

(Phayathai Campus) At the Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital (Phayathai Campus), Mahidol University, there are three fitness training rooms where health personnel and students can access exercises such as cardio training (i.e., treadmill, bike, and stepper) and weight training. Additionally, there are two tennis courts, two tables for table- tennis, and a basketball/football/volleyball court. These recreation services will provide health personnel and students have better health.

Class Registration

The program director/chair will inform graduate students who have been accepted to be master's students to access the website in order to review all details of class registration. Required Textbooks

Students are responsible for preparing themselves for all academic materials and other supplies as stated in the course syllabi. For example, students may be

asked to prepare themselves from electronic journals of research articles or reviews for seminars, journal clubs, and group discussions. They may be asked to do e-learning as assigned. For required textbooks, students may read available required textbooks from the medical library before attending classes. The course instructor will inform the required textbooks in the course syllabus which students can look for additional details.

Didactic

It is the student's responsibility to come to class on time. If any unusual circumstance makes students unable to attend classes, students need to contact the course instructor via the LINE application, e-mail, or telephone. Additionally, it is the student's job to catch up on lessons alone if not presenting to the class. There is no late homework accepted.

Professional Nursing Student Etiquette Guidelines

During and after the COVID-19 pandemic, all interactions are conducted in compliance with students learning at Mahidol University. Students are expected to find a quiet and well-lit space before logging on to the live Zoom, Microsoft team, or Google meeting for a lecture, clinical presentation, or conference. Line application for the group meeting can be used with the group discussion.

Clinical Practice

Clinical practice is an integral part of the nursing program. Students will attend the orientation before beginning the clinical experience in the clinical care settings. In normal circumstances, students will follow the guidelines of the clinical site.

During and after the COVID-19 pandemic, students must promptly follow the regulation of Mahidol University. Everyone has to wear a mask at all times, keep a distance of communication, often wash their hands, eat clean and warm food, and use private utensils required for everyone. Additionally, testing with an antigen test kit (ATK) may be required to submit the test results before entering any clinical site.

Immunization

Generally, students will have vaccination from their own country. Graduate students may have flu and COVID-19 vaccination before going to the clinical care settings.

For COVID-19, students will have vaccination on the campus they are arranged. For example, students at the Phayathai Campus will need to register with citizen identification and will receive vaccines at the Phayathai Campus. After having COVID-19 vaccination, students will receive a vaccine certificate showing the full and last names, type of vaccination, date, and time, and names of providers who give the vaccination. At the Salaya Campus, students have to register and follow the guideline to receive a vaccination. Laboratory guidelines

1. Students wear a uniform to enter the laboratory.
2. No food or drinks are allowed in the laboratory.
3. Only remove something from the lab without the approval of the laboratory instructor.

Uniform and Identification Rules and Regulations

There are regulations available on the website for undergraduate students. Please follow the link of **“Student Uniform-Mahidol University.”** However, graduate students have to wear appropriate dresses when attending classes. When having clinical practice, they need to wear uniform dresses to be suitable for clinical practice.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, students must wear masks when entering campus and clinical care settings. Students may be asked to check for ATK and send the test result to the instructor before the class begins. In the earlier period, if any student had a positive ATK, they would be screened for real-time polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) to confirm the test results and report to the team of nursing faculties at Ramathibodi School of Nursing who had responsibilities of surveillance for COVID-19, using LINE application and links for communication within RSON. Students who got an infection with COVID-19 need to notify the involved authorities to assess the level of risk and comply with the regulations of Mahidol University. Attendance Requirements

Scheduled lectures, labs, and clinical days and hours may have complied with the course syllabus of each subject. However, during the COVID-19 pandemic, all classes were adapted to the live Zoom, Microsoft team, or any live meetings

considered appropriate. Clinical rotations may be rescheduled for appropriate time and arrangement. If any unusual circumstances are occurring with students, they need to notify the course instructor or clinical advisor to solve problems.

Academic Integrity

All students must comply with Mahidol University Regulation on Graduate Studies B.E.2563 (2020). Please view the additional details of “Mahidol University Regulation on Graduate Studies B.E.2563 (2020) in section 13, “Punishment for dishonest students.”

Academic Progression

All students will receive a course syllabus for each course. They need to read all information covering the course description, table of contents, criteria for evaluation, and grading system. Students need to review all materials and ask any questions they might have. All grading system complies with the regulation of Mahidol University. Please see “Mahidol University Regulations on Graduate Studies B.E.2563 (2020) in section 9: Study Time, Evaluation, and Educational Evaluation (Part 1 to Part 9). All master’s nursing students must earn a valid nursing license issued by Thailand and Midwifery Council (TMNC) before entering the nursing program. The nursing license is needed to be renewed every five years.

Admission

Admission policies for graduate students in Master of Nursing Science (Thai curricula and International Program)

Usually, graduate students admit to Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University via the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University. There are six Thai curricula of the master's levels composed the Master of Nursing Science (Adult and Gerontological Nursing), the Master of Nursing Science (Pediatric Nursing), the Master of Nursing Science (Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing), the Master of Nursing Science (Gerontological Nurse Practitioner), the Master of Nursing Science (Community Nurse Practitioner), and the Master of Nursing Science (Nurse Midwifery) and the Master of Nursing Science (international program).

The requirement criteria for master candidates (Thai curricula) who need to study at the master level to apply to the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University, are as follows:

1. Master candidates need to earn a Bachelor of Science (Nursing and Midwifery) or Bachelor of Nursing Science or any nursing certificates equivalency to the Baccalaureate from educational institutes approved by Thailand and Midwifery Council (TNMC) and the Office of Higher Education Commission (OHEC)
2. Cumulative GPA throughout the program is at least 2.5
3. Have a valid nursing license in nursing and midwifery (level 1) or nursing (level 1)
4. Have experience in nursing, nursing education, and nursing administration after the Bachelor's graduation for at least 1 to 3 years
5. Have the passing English score approved by the Graduate Studies, Mahidol University
6. Candidates need to pursue in Gerontological Nurse Practitioner or Community Nurse Practitioner. They need to be trained and certified with the curriculum of nursing specialty in related fields (a 4-month course). These courses are needed to be approved by the TMNC.
7. If the master's candidate has any different admission qualifications, the candidate will be considered by the curriculum admission committee and the Dean of Graduate Studies.

After passing the required criteria for admission, candidates will have a written examination arranged by Mahidol University. The candidates who pass the written examination will be appointed for an interview examination. After finishing the interview examination, candidates will be notified of the results. Those who passed both written and interview examinations will be notified, and additional details will be further processed, followed by the regulation of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University.

However, if master's candidates needed to enroll in the Master of Nursing Science (International Program), they need to be qualified with the required criteria as follows:

1. Earn a Bachelor's degree in nursing.
2. Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
3. Have at least one-year working experience as a professional nurse/instructor after completion of Baccalaureate level
4. Have a valid registered nurse license in his/her own country
5. Have scores of at least 5.5 on IELTS (Academic) or at least 70 on MU GRAD Plus

6. Have good communication in English

Those with the required qualifications will be asked to compose a statement of academic purposes and research interests. The curriculum admission committee will consider them and rearrange them for an interview. Any candidates accepted to study in the new semester of the year will be approved by the curriculum and graduate committee and the Graduate Studies, and they will be notified of the final results of the academic recruitment.

Generally, the semester will be started in the middle of August of every year. Candidates need to submit their application, announced by the Faculty of Graduate Studies and additional details are available via the University web page. (<https://graduate.mahidol.ac.th/inter/>)

Mahidol University Announcement
Living Allowance Scholarship for Foreign Graduate Students
at Mahidol University, Academic Year 2022

The objective of this scholarship is to promote and enhance opportunities for foreign graduate students from ASEAN countries (excluding Singapore and Brunei Darussalam) and developing countries in South Asia, Central Asia and Africa. The scholarship is aimed at those working in educational or research institutes, either public or non-governmental organizations, which are important to the development of ASEAN countries and developing countries in South Asia, Central Asia and Africa. The scholarship was established to enable people from such backgrounds to pursue their education at the graduate level at Mahidol University.

As empowered by the virtue of Article 22.4 in the 'Mahidol University Announcement on Regulations and Methods to Receive, Maintain, Disburse, Pay, and Control Money B.E. 2551' and its revision, which is under Section 38 of the 'Mahidol University Regulation on Budget and Financial Administration B.E. 2551' and its revision, the following Announcement shall be enacted by the President:

1. In this Announcement:

The term "the University" refers to Mahidol University.

The term "the Scholarship" refers to Living Allowance Scholarship for Foreign Graduate Students (Master's and Doctorate degrees) at Mahidol University, Academic Year 2022.

The term "Living Allowance" refers to the monthly allowance for the Grantee while residing in Thailand.

2. The University shall allocate the Scholarship for students who have been accepted to study Master's and Doctorate degrees at Mahidol University (full-time). Scholarship recipients will be granted a monthly allowance of not more than 7,000 Baht per month. The total period for which the Scholarship can be provided is not more than 2 academic years (The Academic Year 2022 – 2023). The University will annually transfer the grant to the Host Affiliate for each academic year (by the announcement of the Faculty of Graduate Studies or program) in order to manage the grant allocation to the Grantee on a monthly basis.

3. The Candidate must be a qualified student according to the eligibility and course requirements of the Faculty of Graduate Studies as follows:

3.1 Being a Mahidol University student with an ASEAN nationality (excluding Singaporean and Bruneian) or nationality of any developing country in South Asia, Central Asia or Africa (list of countries as attached).

3.2 Being a lecturer, a researcher, or a member of an educational or research institute, either public or non-government organizations, which is important to their country's development; or is deemed by his/her Host Affiliate as capable of contributing to graduate according to the study plan.

3.3 Having been accepted to study on Mahidol University's Master's or Doctorate programs in the Academic Year 2022 and student ID begins with 65XXXXXX only.

3.4 Having registered and paid for the tuition fees in the Academic year 2022.

3.5 Being in good health without any contagious diseases.

3.6 Not being a recipient of a full scholarship elsewhere.

4. Consideration and selection criteria

4.1 The Candidate's Host Affiliate or program committee shall implement the screening process based on the eligibility requirements in Clause 3 of this Announcement.

4.2 The University shall select a qualified foreign candidate according to this Announcement, application documents and study plan. If a Candidate's application documents are incomplete, they will not be considered for the scholarship.

4.3 The University shall announce the list of grantees on the International Relations Division website (<http://intranet.mahidol/op/orir>).

5. Required documents

5.1 A nomination letter endorsed by the Dean/Director or Deputy Dean of the Host Affiliate.

5.2 A completed application form for Living Allowance Scholarship for Foreign Graduate Students at Mahidol University (IR-LA), Academic Year 2022, with a 1-inch photo attached.

5.3 A copy of the Letter of Acceptance from the Faculty of Graduate Studies with "Certified True Copy" written thereon and his/her signature.

5.4 A copy of the payment certificate for the tuition fees with "Certified True Copy" written thereon and his/her signature.

5.5 An Academic Calendar from the Faculty of Graduate Studies or Host Affiliate.

5.6 A study plan.

5.7 A copy of the Candidate's passport with arrival date stamped by Immigration with "Certified True Copy" written thereon and his/her signature.

6. Application procedures

6.1 The Candidate can get an application form (IR-LA) from his/her Host Affiliate or download it from www.op.mahidol.ac.th/ir/mu-scholarships: (select "Incoming").

6.2 The Candidate must submit the application form and required documents to the Head of the Host Affiliate through the Host Affiliate's International Relations Office. (The University will not consider an application form directly from the Candidate).

6.3 The Host Affiliate in which the Candidate is currently studying while he/she is applying for the scholarship shall nominate him/her to the University by submitting the application form and required documents in Clause 5 to International Relations Division, Office of the President.

7. Terms and conditions

7.1 The Grantee may receive other supplemental funding resources (such as scholarships from an outside organization/the candidates' own funds/the host affiliate or course funds) to cover the Grantee's tuition fees and other expenses.

7.2 The Grantee must complete the Agreement for the Living Allowance Scholarship 2022 as required, submitting three (3) copies with a 'revenue department' stamp.

7.3 The Host Affiliate will transfer the grant to the Grantee on the day the semester has begun. However, if the Grantee arrives in Thailand **after** the semester has already begun, the Host Affiliate will transfer the grant to the Grantee on the day they arrive in Thailand. The University reserves the right to deduct a percentage of the scholarship calculated by multiplying the number of days that the Grantee has missed by the value of the Scholarship per day. The number of days to be deducted from the Scholarship will be determined by the arrival date stamp in the Grantee's passport.

7.4 If the Grantee attends regular classes or online courses or performs data collection for research or conference or seminars or internship while he/she is residing in Thailand, the University will transfer the grant to the Host Affiliate for each academic year (by the announcement of the Faculty of Graduate Studies or program) in order to manage the grant allocation to the Grantee on a monthly basis.

7.5 If, after having already arrived in Thailand, the Grantee attends regular classes or online courses or performs data collection for research or conference or seminars or internship while he/she is residing outside of Thailand, or travels back to their own country more than 2 weeks, the Grantee will not receive Living Allowance for time spent outside of Thailand. The Host Affiliate will begin to transfer the grant to the Grantee again on the day of arrival back in Thailand. The University reserves the right to deduct a percentage of the scholarship calculated by multiplying the number of days that the Grantee has missed by the value of the Scholarship per day. The number of days to be deducted from the Scholarship will be determined by the arrival date stamp in the Grantee's passport. In case that the University has transferred the grant to the Grantee, the Grantee's Host Affiliate must reimburse the remaining amount of the Scholarship to the University.

7.6 If the Grantee has been accepted to study in the second semester of the Academic year 2022 (2nd /2022), the Grantee will receive a grant for one more semester (1st semester of the Academic 2024).

7.7 If the Grantee is unable to complete his/her study or terminates as stated in Clause 2, the University will cancel the scholarship immediately. **The Grantee must reimburse the remaining amount of the Scholarship to the University, which will then be allocated to other Candidates.** If the Grantee needs to abort his/her study and return to their home country due to an emergency, he/she can send an explanation letter to the University via his/her Host Affiliate for consideration.

7.8 If the Grantee is able to complete their studies before the end of the 2-year Scholarship period, **the granting of the Scholarship shall immediately end. In such cases, the Grantee's Host Affiliate must reimburse the remaining amount of the Scholarship to the University which will be allocated to other Candidates.**

7.9 The Host Affiliate must transfer the grant to the Grantee on a monthly basis and collect the original receipt as evidence.

7.10 The Host Affiliate must ensure that the Grantee completes their studies on time and submit the copy of the official transcript of the Grantee's to the University within sixty (60) days after the end of each semester. If the Host Affiliate does not submit these reports, the University will delay the following disbursement of the Scholarship.

8. Application deadline

The University will close its application process at the end of May 2023 or until the budget has run out.

9. The Scholarship disbursement

9.1 The Scholarship stated in this Announcement must be disbursed from the University's income according to the 'Mahidol University Regulation on Budget and Financial Administration B.E.2551' and its revision.

9.2 The head of the Grantee's Host Affiliate must send a request letter for disbursement, with the Grantee list and the Agreement for the Living Allowance Scholarship in three (3) copies for Foreign Graduate Student at Mahidol University attached as follows:

- First: For the Academic year 2022
- Second: For the Academic year 2023

10. The President of Mahidol University is in a position of authority over this Announcement. In the event of any dispute, the judgment of the President shall be final.

Community nurse practitioner program is a field of study that focus on the analysis of health problems, factors determining health status and management of common health problems in individuals, families, and communities through screening, referral, primary medical care of all ages, health promotion, disease prevention and disease management, chronic conditions and end-of-life care in the community by integrating knowledge from Community Nurse Practitioner, Epidemiology, Population studies, Medicine, Technology and empirical evidence, Public policy for health including ethics, codes of conduct, law, the arts of nursing. An understanding of experience and humanity to create a practical process and good outcomes for individuals, families, target groups, communities, and health service systems

Course objectives

This program aims to develop leaders with a strong sense of nursing science in community nurse practitioner and related sciences. It can be integrated with empirical evidence in teaching nursing practice and research to enhance the quality of nursing services at the individual, family, target group and community levels.

Graduates can be nurses/researchers/ academics/professionals in community medicine nursing.

Philosophy of the course

Master of Nursing Science Program In Gerontological Nurse Practitioner is a field of study that deals with comprehensive health assessment, screening, early diagnosis and primary medical care. It includes emergency care and referral, planning, nursing care, and outcome evaluation in caring for the healthy older adults, at-risk groups, acute and chronic illnesses, long-term care, and end-of-life care either in the community or long-term care facilities. The study in the curriculum is believed to create professional nurses who can effectively perform gerontological nurse practitioner, be a leader in system building, team building, and health management, in accordance with the competency of nursing practitioners and the gerontological nurse prescribed by the Thailand Nursing and Midwifery Council (TNMC) for the older persons to maintain their good health and quality of life.

Teaching and learning management focuses on student-centered by developing students to be able to lifelong learning and be able to track their academic progress and updated technology, learning from practice in the clinic, and creating a working culture of excellence based on sufficiency economy.

Course objectives

To create a graduate with leadership with profound knowledge in gerontological nurse practitioner by integrating related sciences and empirical evidence in nursing practice, primary medical care, emergencies assistance according to professional scope and referrals for effective treatment and conducting research to improve the quality of nursing services in the older persons, including in normal conditions, acute illness, chronic and end-of-life conditions.

Conduct research study related to the health promotion of the older adults in all phases of illness trajectory, including chronic, dependence, long-term, and end-of-life conditions to lead the quality health care for the older persons by integrating nursing science and related sciences, empirical evidence, cultural diversity, and moral ethics
4. Perform leadership, management, and initiate or design the development of quality of care for the older persons as well as having communication skills and working as a team, collaboration with health care teams and related social networks for quality and safety management of the older persons and their families
5. Applied digital technology and information, choose reliable information and analyze data for the health information management of older adult patient and family, risk management to improve service quality and communicate in continuing care coordination
6. Perform nursing practice, health promotion, disease prevention, screening and referring, primary medical care of common health problems of older persons, emergency care as well as rehabilitation and caring for dependent older persons or with chronic illnesses to access the health care service system thoroughly end-of-life care by engaging family and their social networks and taking into account cultural differences
